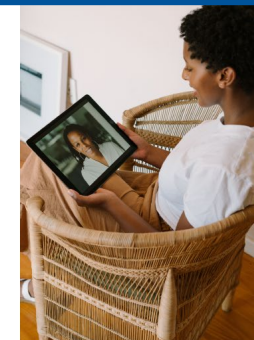
Pathways to Parenthood is a program to help female cancer survivors make family building decisions.

Throughout the program you will learn new information along with coping skills to help in making an informed decision about family building.

This site is designed to support you throughout the program.

Purpose of the Study

- Cancer survivors diagnosed during their reproductive years may experience fertility challenges due to their cancer treatments that can impact their options for family building
- Female cancer survivors may also have concerns about their health and the health of their child if they do become pregnant in the future
- We are developing a new program to address cancer survivors' family building concerns and to help clarify survivors' family building options

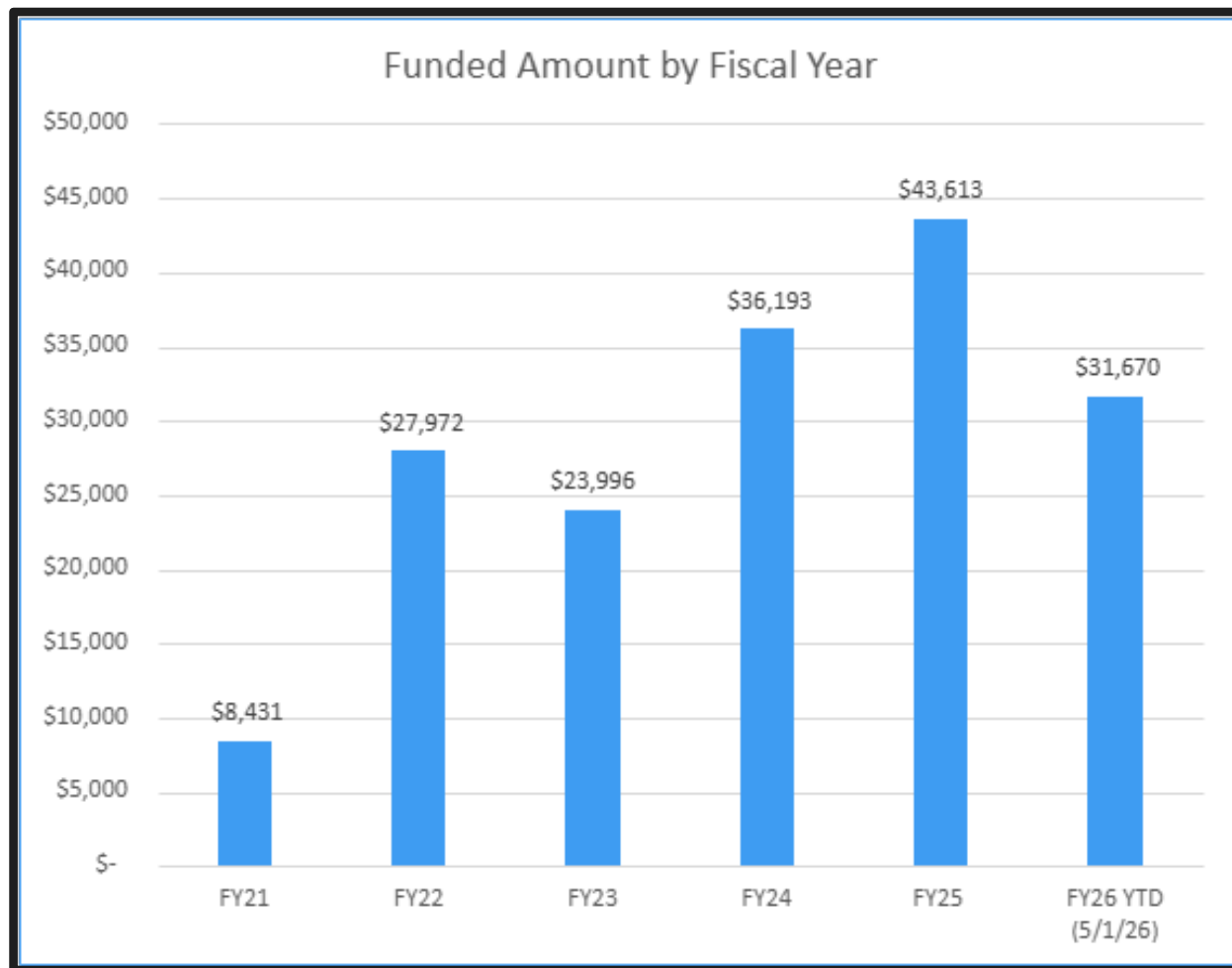
